This statue of Athena once decorated the pediment that showed the Gigantomachy, that is, the battle between the Olympian Gods and the Giants. The Goddess wears the aegis, an overcoat, with frightening snakes around its edges. The Goddess' opponent was the Giant Engelados of which only part of a foot survives!
